

## IOANNIS SYMEONIDIS

### CURRICULUM VITAE

He was born in Thessaloniki on September 14, 1959.

After finishing his studies at Experimental High School of Thessaloniki, he went to law school at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. He was granted a scholarship with honors by the Institution of Government Scholarships and received his honors law degree in 1982.

After finishing his military service, he attended Post Graduate School of Public Law at the University of Thessaloniki for two years, with an emphasis on the subject of administrative law.

In 1984 he acquired a licence to practice law.

Afterwards he started working on his doctoral thesis on the subject of "The nature of actions of the legal persons of private law in the public sector" under the supervision of Professor M. A. Tahos. His thesis was approved in March 1991.

In 1986 he entered, after competition, the board of Administrative Justice and now he possesses the title of Court of Appeal Judge in Thessaloniki.

In 1993 he was appointed lecturer at the School of Law of Aristotle University of Thessaloniki for a period of three years, on the subject of administrative law. His service was renewed in 1996, when he acquired an educational leave of absence to study in France. Since November 1999 he has been Assistant Professor and in 2009 he became Associate Professor. During the academic year 2011-2012 he was elected Head of Public Law Department and member ex officio of the Administration Council. In 2015 he was promoted to first rank Professor.

He took part in administrative committees. He was elected member of the Council of the Administrative Court of Thessaloniki. He was a committee member of the district of Administrative Court of Appeals of Thessaloniki. In 2005 he was elected member of the Administrative Council of the Union of Administrative Judges, where he stayed for two years as vice president. Moreover he has taught in the school of Police Officers' training and in the National School of Judges. In

addition, he was repeatedly assessor of the staff recruitment in public sector. Since 2014 he participates in the working group for the quality of Justice (CEPEJ-GT-QUAL) as an expert.

He knows both French and English.
