I. Biographical note

Vassilios Kourtis is an Assistant Professor of Private International Law at the Faculty of Law, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. He earned his bachelor's and master's degree as well his doctorate at the School of Law of Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. He attended courses on U.S. Law in the Netherlands and also the courses of the Academy of European Law at the EUI in Florence. From 2007 to 2010 he worked as a part-time lecturer at the School of Law of Aristotle University and during the previous years he had worked as a teaching assistant at the same School of Law. He worked as scientific collaborator on a great number of research and teaching projects elaborated at the Law School of the Aristotle University as well as abroad.

He teaches *Private International Law* on the undergraduate and postgraduate level and *Immigration Law* and *Law of International Transactions* on the undergraduate level. He also teaches in the English-speaking course *Private International Law addressed to* students of the ERASMUS/SOCRATES program. During the period 2011-2013, he also taught *Immigration Law* to students of the French-Greek postgraduate programme on European Social Law. His scientific interests include Private International Law in the strict and broad sense, Comparative Law and certain areas of human rights. He is Attorney-at-Law, member of the Bar Association of Thessaloniki.
