

Manztoufas Panagiotis graduated from the Law School of AUTH with a grade of "Excellent 9.13". During his studies (academic years 1984-1985, 1985-1986, 1986-1987, 1987-1988) he was receiving IKY's national scholarship. He completed his post-graduate studies in the Department of Public Law and Political Science of the Law School of AUTH and gained his master's degree with a grade of "Excellent". He defended his Thesis on the subject "Academic freedom: Organizational and procedural overview. The constitutional framework of the academics' evolution" before a seven-member Committee, which unanimously found him worthy and he was awarded a PhD title in Legal Sciences of the AUTH Law School in December 1996. From 1997 to 2000, he was teaching Organization of Education in the AUTH School of Primary Education and teachers' training programs.
